These Questions are not intended as exercises for the intellect. The objects aimed at in them are the forming early of a habit of attention in reading the holy scriptures, and fixing in the memory some of the great truths and facts those scriptures record.

To meet their different capacities, the easier questions have been separated in each chapter from the others, and are placed before them. Those which have an asterisk prefixed to them, cannot be answered from scripture.
